### **Read Proverbs 4**

### **Discuss**

### **Adult and Student Discussion Questions**

- From verse 6, how can we heed Solomon's warning not to forsake wisdom?
- Verse 14 tells us not to "enter the path of the wicked." How do we balance this warning with the command not to judge in Matthew 7:1 (assuming you'd have to recognize the wicked to avoid joining them)?
- What is Solomon addressing in verse 26?

Certainly, in Matthew 7:1, Jesus did forbid judging in one sense... But for now, note that if you read through that same gospel of Matthew, you'll find that Jesus also clearly called us to rebuke others for sin, even rebuking them publicly if need be (Matt. 18:15-17; cf. Luke 17:3)... if we cannot say how a Christian should not live, how can we say how a Christian should live? - Mark Dever

### Kids Discussion Questions

- Proverbs is a book of wise sayings collected and written by King Solomon for his son. In this chapter, he wants to make sure that his son listens to him. What are some reasons it honors God listen to our parents?
- In verse 26, Solomon tells us to "ponder the path of our feet," or to think before we act. Why is this important?

- What does verse 34 tell us about the search for wisdom?

- Why can we as Christians have hope even when we are not wise?
